**Ans: Two Famous Celebrities of Pakistan**

**1. Imran Khan:**

Imran Ahmed Khan Niazi born 5 October 1952, is the 22nd and current Prime Minister of Pakistan and the chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI). Before entering politics, Khan was an international cricketer and captain of the Pakistan national cricket team, which he led to victory in the 1992 Cricket World Cup. In 1991, he launched a fundraising campaign to set up a cancer hospital in memory of his mother. In April 1996, Khan founded the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf. In the 2018 general elections, his party won the largest number of seats and defeated the ruling PML-N, bringing Khan to premiership and the PTI into federal government for the first time.

**2. Abdul Qadeer Khan**

Dr. Abdul Qadeer Khan is a Pakistani nuclear physicist metallurgical engineer and columnist who founded the uranium enrichment program for Pakistan's atomic bomb project. Dr. Abdul Qadeer Khan founded and established the Kahuta Research Laboratories in 1976. During his time in the atomic bomb project, he pioneered research in the thermal quantum field. In 1998, India conducted the series of nuclear tests at the site located in Pokhran, Rajasthan. In its reaction, his team made successful detonation of Pakistan's first nuclear devices on May 28, 1998. In January 2004, the Pakistani Government summoned Khan for a debriefing on his active role in nuclear weapons technology proliferation through Kayani. After years of official house arrest during and following his debriefing, the Islamabad High Court on 6 February 2009 declared Abdul Qadeer Khan to be a free citizen of Pakistan.
